Kolacia advised that the members of the 28E Communication Board need to meet and approve the communication budget. This needs to happen by mid-December each year, so that cities and county can include that

budget information while preparing their individual budgets.

Kolacia presented a revised letter to Reserve Deputies Gaming Letter.

Teleconference with Story County Board of Supervisor's Consider approval of the following levies for joint districts: -Boone 80/ Story 3, a levy of 23% will raise \$22,260.58 leaving a balance of \$8,049.1-Boone 93B/Story 4, a levy of 140.5% will raise \$140,500.00 leaving a balance of \$5,274.87-Boone 143/ Story 8, a levy of 48% will raise \$10,109.04 leaving a balance of \$7,610.88-Boone 201/ Story 10, a levy of 10% will raise \$5,806.72 leaving a balance of \$3,365.00. REPORT WILL NOT BE MAILED TO INDIVIDUALS, COPIES CAN BE PICKED UP AT THE UTILITIES OFFICE. This report contains important information regarding the water quality in our water system. The source of our water is groundwater. Our water quality testing shows the following results:

ppb - parts per billion. ppm - parts per million. pCi/L - picocuries per liter. N/A - Not applicable. ND - Not detected. RAA - Running Annual Average. Treatment Technique (TT) - A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Action Level (AL) - The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

SGL - Single Sample Result. RTCR - Revised Total Coliform Rule. NTU - Nephelometric Turbidity Units. GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain

at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water posed a health risk. SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

This water supply obtains its water from the sand and gravel of the Alluvial aquifer. The Alluvial aquifer was determined to be highly susceptible to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide little protection from contamination at the land surface. The Alluvial wells will be highly susceptible to surface contaminants such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills, and excess fertilizer application.
